Dear Colleague

We are delighted to present this programme for our tenth Conference.

Our Industry has continued to live in challenging times, with the supply of capital continuing to drive competition, leading to an ongoing squeeze on margins, with customers and regulators expecting, if not requiring, more at the same time.
